# TOWN MEETING MINUTES MARCH 3, 1959

The annual meeting of the legal voters of the Town of Clarendon, held on the above date at 10 A. M. Standard Time in the Clarendon Town Hall, was called to order by the Moderator. Amherst Weeks.

The Warning was read by the Moderator and business transacted according to the Warning as follows:

Article 1. Moderator Amherst Weeks was elected Moderator. Article 2. Town Report. A motion was made and seconded that the Town Report be accepted. Motion carried by acclama-

Article 3. Road Commissioner. The motion was made, seconded and carried that the Road Commissioner be elected by ballot.

Article 4. Town Officers—

Town Clerk—Mary H. Pratt elected by acclamation

Town Treasurer—Mary H. Pratt elected by acclamation.

Selectman—Nominations—Charles Ruane and Milton Squier. By ballot Charles Ruane 35, Milton Squier 18. Necessary for choice 28 votes. Charles Ruane elected for a term of three

OVERSEER OF POOR—George Holden elected by acclamation.

LISTER—Ballot necessary. Milton Squier nominated. Motion made, seconded and carried that the Town Clerk cast one vote for Milton Squier. It was so done.

Milton Squier elected Lister for a term of three years.

AUDITOR—Ballot necessary. Carroll Weeks nominated. Motion made, seconded and carried that the Town Clerk cast one vote for Carroll Weeks. It was so done.

Carroll Weeks elected Auditor for a term of three years.

Constable—George Holden elected by acclamation.

No second Constable elected.

Town Grand Juror—Aldace Newton elected by acclamation. Town Agent—Aldace Newton elected Town Agent by acclama-

TRUSTEE OF PUBLIC MONEY-Aldace Newton elected by ac-

School Director—Ballot necessary. Zeola Raiche nominated for a term of three years. Motion made, seconded and carried that the Town Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Mrs. Raiche. It was so done. Zeola Raiche elected School Director for a term of three years.

Irene Hill nominated School Director for a term of two years. The motion was made, seconded and carried that the Town Clerk cast one ballot for Mrs. Hill. It was so done.

ROAD COMMISSIONER—Ballot necessary. Carl Lanfear nominated. Motion made, seconded and carried that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Carl Lanfear. It was so done. Carl Lanfear elected Road Commissioner.

Article 5. Town Highways—The motion was made, seconded and carried that 25c on the dollar of the Grand List be spent

on Town Roads.

Article 6. Resurfacing—Motion made, seconded and carried by acclamation that the Town spend up to \$500.00 on Resurfacing if matched by the State.

Article 7. Black Top—Motion made, seconded and carried by acclamation that the Town vote up to \$2,000.00 for new Black

Top.

Article 8. Retreatment—Motion made seconded and carried by acclamation that the Town vote up to \$3,000.00 for Retreatment.

Article 9. Tuition—Motion made, seconded and carried that the Town pay the minimum (\$325.00) for tuition for High School Students.

Article 10. Taxes to the Treasurer—Motion made, seconded and carried that Town Taxes be paid to the Town Treasurer.

Article 11. Malt and Vinous Beverages—Carried by ballot. Yes 40; No 12.

Article 12. Spirituous Liquors—Carried by ballot. Yes 34;

No 18.

Article 13. Borrowing Money—Motion made, seconded and carried that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow money for

Town Expenses if necessary.

Article 14. Truck—Motion made, seconded and carried by acclamation that the Selectmen be authorized to trade Town Truck \$1 toward a new truck, and that the new truck be purchased by bid.

Article 15. Well on School Property—North Clarendon. Motion was made and seconded that the voters give the School Directors a vote of confidence—let the School Directors decide about drilling a well.

No decision by Acclamation. By ballot Yes 36; No 28.

Motion carried.

Article 16. \$2,000.00 for Well-North Clarendon. Motion

was made that the matter be left to the School Directors. No second. A motion was made and seconded that the Town vote \$2,000.00 for a well on the School Property at North Clarendon. After discussion the Motion was amended to read as follows—

A Motion was made and seconded that the Town vote \$2,000.00 for a water system for the School property at North

Clarendon. Motion carried by acclamation.

Article 17. Sales Tax—Motion made, seconded and carried

against a Sales Tax.

Article 18. Forest Land—Motion made, seconded and carried by acclamation that the Selectmen be authorized to acquire such land.

Article 19. West Rutland Fire Company Services—Motion made, seconded and carried by acclamation that the Town secure and pay for the services of the West Rutland Fire Company for the Town of Clarendon.

Article 20. Taxes - General—Motion made, seconded and carried by acclamation for a Tax of \$2.50 for the General Ac-

count.

Article 21. Taxes - School—Motion made, and seconded for a School Tax of \$4.75. Motion made and seconded for a School Tax of \$5.00.

Taking the higher tax first. The vote was against a \$5.00 Tax. By acclamation a Tax of \$4.75 was voted for the School Account.

Article 22. Other Business—Mr. Fernett spoke upon the

question of help which he has had from the Town.

Mr. Moulton reported upon what is being attempted in Montpelier in the Legislature to relieve the situation of small tax

payments by Rutland on the Airport property.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that a book be gotten out by the Listers which will show all recent appraisals of property—that is as follows: Name of property owner, acreage, appraised value, amount assessed. This is to be done as soon as the Spring appraisals are completed. This motion to apply to this year only.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 1:25 P. M.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The Board of Selectmen for the Town of Clarendon held its first meeting of the year on March 7, 1959. Percy E. Teer was appointed Chairman of the Board.

The following officers were appointed for the ensuing year.:

Fence Viewers—Richard Pratt, Henry Potter and Russell Powers.

Pound Keepers—Hiram Spafford, Isadore LaVictoire.

Weigher of Coal—John Pratt.

Inspector of wood, shingles, etc.—Howard O. Pierce.

Tree Warden—Harold Johnson, Jr.

George Grover, Fire Warden for the Town for many years, having resigned William Lind was recommended by the Selectmen and approved and appointed by the State to take his place.

The Selectmen recommended Carroll Rich for Town Health Officer. The recommendation was accepted by the State Board of Health and Mr. Rich was appointed Health Officer for the ensuing three years.

Arrangements were made for the purchase of officer's bonds from Mr. Stafford of Wallingford.

It was decided to continue holding Selectmen's Meetings on the first Saturday afternoon of every month.

The Selectmen voted to ask the West Rutland Fire Company to serve the West part of Town in case of fire. An agreement with West Rutland was reached similar to that which Clarendon now has with Rutland City.

A new truck, an International, was purchased for the Town from Seward Sales and Service. The old truck, purchased in 1952, is to be kept for summer use drawing gravel etc.

The Selectmen and Road Commissioner met with Mr. Durkee, the District Engineer, in May. Plans were made for summer work on Clarendon Roads. Retreatment and Construction were agreed upon; Black Top on the Creek Road to be completed as far as the Four Corners.

The Selectmen have endeavored to buy land for a dump for Clarendon but without success. No one seems to want to sell land for that purpose. Mr. Rich received a petition about the dump. He also, with the approval of the Selectmen, has tried to buy land and with the same unsatisfactory results.

It was suggested that the Town enter into some agreement with Wallingford for the use of the Wallingford Dump. Your Selectmen and Mr. Rich took up the matter with the Wallingford Selectmen. The Town of Wallingford asks \$800.00 per year for the use of their dump. Since your Town Officers feel this price is exorbitant nothing further has been done.

The Selectmen and Listers have been working upon the matter of a larger tax on the Rutland City Airport property. Until this year, by an agreement made with Rutland City some fifteen years ago, Clarendon has received \$187.00 "in lieu of tax" every year on this property. After much discussion, trips to Montpelier, etc. Rutland City has agreed to an appraisal of \$10,000.00 on the Airport, the tax on this appraisal to be figured at the current tax rate voted in Town Meeting each year. This is the tax on the Airport property alone, not including the Butler House and other property owned by Rutland in Clarendon. The Airport tax this year was \$725.00. This contract will continue in effect until December 31, 1968 barring some unforeseen circumstance.

Two bridges, one over Otter Creek on SA \*3 and one over Cold River on SA \*1, were cleaned and painted.

Nothing has been done about drilling a well on the North Clarendon School property. The School Board thinks that the Selectmen should take charge of the project whereas the Selectmen feel that, according to the vote at Town Meeting, the matter is entirely in the hands of the School Board. No one satisfactory to all concerned has been found to drill the well and as yet there seems to be no agreement as to just where on the property the well should be drilled.

Applications for State Aid for Winter Maintenance, 1959-1960, were drawn up and signed. Carl Lanfear was appointed manager of Winter Maintenance.

The Town Hall roof which had been leaking for some time was repaired.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Directors and Citizens of Clarendon, Vermont:

I submit my seventh annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

The Clarendon Schools opened on Wednesday, September 9, 1959 with a total enrollment of 152 pupils.

Last spring the School Directors decided to combine the two schools at North Clarendon since at that time anticipated pupil enrollment did not justify two separate schools. When the North School opened this fall with grades 1-8. the enrollment steadily increased. Recently two grades from the North School were assigned to the Flats School and transportation provided. This leaves 1-6 and an enrollment of 25 pupils in this school.

The School Directors have placed an article in the warning for town meeting concerning a new school for the North Clarendon and Hill areas. A two-room building would provide facilities that are needed by the children of North Clarendon and are already being enjoyed by the children in our other schools.

Last summer much needed work was done in the Clarendon Schools. At East Clarendon the classrooms and toilets were painted and new lights and curtains were installed in the upper grade room. At the Flats School, both classrooms were painted. The Chippenhook School received new siding to insulate the building. These improvements have helped the appearance of our schools and provided a better setting for your children to learn.

The teachers in the Clarendon Schools are concerned with providing the best classroom instruction that they can for the children. Through teachers meetings, instruction in each school is co-ordinated with the other schools. Text books and other instructional supplies are being supplied to the best of our ability.

An important part of the School Budget is the tuition of high school students. During the past school year, these students attended the following schools:

Tuition for these pupils cost \$22,083.89, which was an average of \$249.09 per pupil. All the high schools that Clarendon pupils attend are raising their tuition charges for the next school year with the exception of one. Tuition is 36% of our proposed budget for next year.

Your School Directors and Superintendent recommend that the same school tax of \$4.75 be voted for the school year beginning on July 1, 1960. This tax will enable us to operate your schools on a sound financial basis.

# VERMONT STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH ANNUAL TOWN REPORT, 1959

The health of the town of Clarendon is the concern of its citizens, its doctors, health officer, selectmen and the State Department of Health.

Through its various programs the State Department of Health staff with and for local people on community health, operating on both local and state levels. This letter is a report of the State Health Department services and programs your town used.

With the aim of keeping children well and helping handicapped children, well-child and school conferences were attended by 69 children. Nutrition and dietary consultations numbered 0\*. At the request of attending doctors 0\* children received pediatric consultations, 0\* received hospital diagnosis, 5 with orthopedic, cardiac, plastic or neurological conditions received services or appliances through clinics for handicapped children and 1\* was given financial aid toward hospitalization costs. Mental retardation clinic services were extended to 0\* children.

In the effort to control communicable disease 5 persons received chest X-rays; 127 children received immunizations, including boosters, against diphtheria, whooping cough and/or tetanus. Polio immunications, including boosters, were given 39 children and adults. The State Laboratory performed tests on 12 water samples, 0 food and dairy products, 35 blood specimens and 9 other specimens. Vaccines, antitoxins and biologicals were distributed for protection against communicable diseases.

There were 48 sanitary inspections or consultations made at the town's food and lodging places and 12 concerning water supply, sewage disposal, public buildings and other problems, to protect health through improved town santiation. Services to maintain and improve adult health in industry included 0 chest X-rays and inspections and consultations at plants. In connection with the state licensing programs and the Hill-Burton federal aid program for hospital and medical facility construction there were 0 inspections-consultations to hospitals, nursing homes and homes for the aged.

Mental health services, through guidance clinics, educational meetings or consultations, were received by 0\* persons and groups. Individual interviews with the psychiatrist, psychologist or psychiatric social worker were given 2\*. Under the community

mental health program to develop local projects for precvention, treatment or education in mental health, financial assistance and staff consultations are available.

In cancer work 2 received diagnosis and treatment at tumor clinics, or were financially helped with hospitalization costs.

The Public Health nurse, with headquarters in Rutland City, served at well-child and school conferences, X-ray and immunization clinics, assisted by local people. She visited homes, doctors and agencies, making 173 visits on behalf of 32 persons and community health activities. Her service is an essential element in the department's program for health promotion, disease prevention, diagnosis, treatment and education.
